

Our mission is to be **a beacon of hope** in our community, connecting individuals and families with life-changing support, services, and housing that foster the independence and resiliency to live their best lives.



Founded in 1985, Community Hope addresses the needs of individuals and their families affected by serious mental illness.



Transitional Housing Program (THP)

THP serves 45 individuals recovering from serious and persistent mental illness. Support services are provided to ensure successful community tenure, maximized independence and an improved quality of life. Individuals participating in the Transitional Housing Program are in various stages of mental

health recovery. Support services provided by our team are consistent with the principles of wellness and recovery and psychosocial rehabilitation. Services are provided in affordable, shared homes and apartments throughout Morris County, New Jersey.

Community Support Services (CSS)

CSS serves 89 individuals recovering from a mental illness. The program is designed to enable individuals to live independently in affordable permanent housing with the help of ongoing counseling and support services consistent with the principles of wellness and recovery and supportive housing. The program is available to support individuals residing in Northern NJ including Morris, Somerset, Sussex, and Warren Counties.

Housing Programs

Affordable Housing Program (AHP)

Our AHP has 66 units available to individuals with special needs, including veterans and mental health consumers. The housing

opportunities through AHP are intended to be permanent and for as long as the individual chooses. The rental units are designed to provide independent and safe living environments while encouraging individuals to receive rehabilitative services from Community Hope or another mental health or special needs agency.



Eviction Diversion Program

Community Hope's Eviction Diversion Initiative is a homeless prevention program which aims to improve housing stability for New Jersey individuals and families facing eviction. This program focuses on addressing the needs of the most vulnerable and at-risk individuals who, without additional support services, would become homeless.

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Through our **Hope for Veterans**® **Programs**, we have rescued over 6,000 veterans and their families from homelessness and despair. We believe that those who honorably served our country and defended our freedom deserve a roof over their head and to live with dignity.





Veterans Programs

Since 2004, Community Hope has been the leading New Jersey charity housing homeless and at-risk veterans and their families.

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

SSVF is a homeless prevention and rapid re-housing program providing temporary financial assistance, employment counseling, housing search and case management and other services to help low-income veterans and veteran families remain housed or obtain permanent housing in 15 counties in NJ.

Hope for Veterans Program (HVP)

HVP is a 95-bed transitional housing program for homeless veterans located on the grounds of the VA Medical Center in Lyons, NJ. Our HVP program offers homeless veterans a safe and supportive environment where they can start rebuilding their lives.

Alfred J. Thomas Home for Veterans (AJT)

AJT is an 8-bed transitional housing program for homeless veterans located in Garfield, Bergen County, NJ. Both AJT and HVP are open to veterans in need of mental health clinical services.

Women Veterans Housing (WVH)

This program is a 4 bedroom home designed in partnership with Family Promise and Homeless Solutions to provide permanent affordable housing in a women only neighborhood of homes in Morris County, New Jersey. Our unique program addresses the needs of the most vulnerable and at-risk women who served in our US military, who without additional support services would become homeless. The program supports women to live independently in affordable permanet housing with the help of ongoing counseling and support services consistent with the principles of wellness and recovery and supportive housing.
